THE ARTIST

Test Card Girl is a solo project by Manchester, UK singer/songwriter Catherine Burgis who started unexpectedly writing songs in 2019 aged 35. She takes her name from the iconic image of the girl and clown used by the BBC on UK television to signal the end of evening broadcasting in the 1980s: a girl trapped in a technicolour world of screens and machines. Bored of an admin-based existence, Catherine set off on a song-writing journey into all corners of her mind and released her first single in September 2020 after which she received an Arts Council England grant to write and release her first EP. Since then, her music has been championed by John Kennedy (Radio X), Steve Lamacq, Marc Riley and Guy Garvey (BBC 6Music) and she was named one of 6 Music 'Ones to Watch' in 2021. In January 2022 she was announced as one of Manchester International Festival's MIF Sounds Artists and long-listed for the Glastonbury Emerging Talent Competition. In 2023 she was Andy Burnham's Greater Manchester artist of the month and went on to support Slow Readers Club, Lambert and Darren Hayman (Hefner) among many others. She took some time out to have two children but is back in 2026 with new music and live dates.

THE TRACK

I Feel the Love on You is a euphoric slice of Mancunian synth-pop about breaking up but not quite moving on. A nod to New Order and the great keyboard pop of the 1980s, it layers bright, propulsive synths with big folk-rooted vocal harmonies and an irresistible pop chorus. Bittersweet at its heart but defiantly uplifting, it's a song about still feeling the pull of someone long after you probably shouldn't. It's the first single from upcoming album Song From Films that Don't Exist which will be out in later 2026.
